We were called Team Iguala. Four doctors and 6 technicians. Two doctors from California, one doctor actually was a student at Berkley, California and one doctor from Portland, OR. Two technicians were from Stockton, California and one from Davis, California who was the daughter of one of the doctors and the three technicians from Missouri.

On Friday we provided glasses for 425 patients and on Saturday another 495, totaling 920 patients.

There were over 5,000 pairs of glasses provided.
